Anthony Edwards, Emmy, Golden Globe, and Screen Actors Guild Award-winning Actor, Director, and Producer and Chairman of the Board of Directors, 1in6—a non-profit founded to help men who have had abusive sexual experiences live healthier, happier lives. As a survivor of child sexual abuse at the hands of his mentor, Tony is determined to share his experiences of trauma and healing with the world. As a spokesperson for 1in6, he is especially passionate about uplifting male survivors of abuse and spreading awareness of this deeply stigmatized issue. Tony is most well known for his work as Dr. Mark Greene on the popular television series "ER" and as Nick Bradshaw "Goose" in the blockbuster film "Top Gun."



Rosie Hidalgo, Special Assistant to the President and Senior Advisor on Gender-Based Violence, White House Gender Policy Council. For over 25 years, Rosie has worked in public policy, within the movement to end gender-based violence as a national advocate and attorney. She has held senior positions at Casa de Esperanza: National Latin@ Network for Healthy Families, the U.S. Department of Justice during the Obama-Biden Administration, and also served on a detail to the Office of the Vice President, working with the White House Advisor on Violence Against Women.

Together for Girls—a global partnership working to end violence against children and adolescents, particularly sexual violence against girls and member of Executive Committee, Global Partnership to End Violence Against Children. She has served in leading roles at the United Nations Foundation, where she developed the foundation's gender integration strategy and the U.S. Department of State, where she led the integration of gender issues into foreign policy and investments in global health and helped develop the first International U.S. Government Strategy to End Gender-Based Violence.
